SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

Florida SouthWestern Collegiate High School-Lee (FSWC-Lee), formerly known as Edison Collegiate High School, opened its doors to students in the fall of 2010 on the Florida SouthWestern State College Lee County campus in Fort Myers, Florida. As a fully accredited charter school in the State of Florida, FSWC-Lee serves students in grades 9-12 drawn from Lee County through an open enrollment policy. Currently there are 417 students. The current student population is 57% female and 43% male. Approximately 47% of students indicated their ethnicity is white, 33% Hispanic/Latino, 9% black, 6% Asian Pacific, 1% American Indian, and 4% multi-racial. 27% of students receive free or reduced lunch.

The purpose of FSWC-Lee is to provide a quality academic experience for high school students seeking the challenge of high academic standards, rigorous curricula, and college-level study at a small high school, which promotes a caring environment focusing on critical thinking, communication, and collaboration for each individual. The four-year curriculum provides the opportunity for students to complete a high school diploma and an Associate in Arts degree simultaneously.

CURRICULUM

The academic program for 9th and 10th grade students is organized in a traditional 7-period school day with 49-minute classes. All high school core courses are taught at the honors level. FSWC-Lee offers honors classes in English I and II, Algebra I and II, Geometry, Biology, Integrated Science, Anatomy & Physiology, World History, Economics, and U.S. Government. Additional classes include World Cultural Geography, Anthropology, Marine Science, STEM 1 & 2, Critical Thinking through Art, Humanities, Peer Counseling, Personal, Career & School Development, Personal Financial Literacy, Yearbook, Personal Fitness and H.O.P.E.

80% of FSWC-Lee's faculty hold advanced degrees. The student-teacher ratio is 20:1.

All FSWC-Lee 11th and 12th graders attend Florida SouthWestern State College as fulltime, early admission students. 11th and 12th grade students must have an unweighted cumulative grade point average of 3.0 and demonstrate college-level communication and computation on the Next-Generation AC-CUPLACER (or an alternative assessment) to be eligible for dual enrollment.

ACTIVITES ON CAMPUS

Students are encouraged to participate in a variety of extracurricular activities sponsored by both the high school and FSW State College:

- High School: Key Club, Game Club, Disc Golf, Zumba, Jewelry Club, Drama Club, Career Explorations, Peer Mentorship, Peer Tutoring, National Honor Society, Young Author's Society, Volleyball Club
- College Campus: FSW Honors Program, Model UN, Student Government, Phi Theta Kappa, FSW Peer Mentors, FSW's registered student organizations: fsw.edu/studentengagement

FSWC-Lee does not offer high school athletics, but student athletes are invited to participate on sports teams at other Lee county high schools.

SCHOOL MISSION

At Florida SouthWestern Collegiate High School, our mission is to provide students with an accelerated opportunity to participate in a highly relevant and applicable educational experience through hands-on experiential and interdisciplinary teaching and learning.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

FSWC-Lee students must have a minimum of 24 credits taken in high school years per Florida Department of Education statute. Within these 24 credits, the following subjects are required:

- English: 4 credits
- Mathematics: 4 credit (must include Algebra I and Geometry)
- Science: 3 credits (must include Biology and 2 credits must have a laboratory component)
- **Social Studies**: 3 credits (1 credit U.S. History, 1 credit World History, .5 credit American Government, .5 credit Economics)
- Fine and Performing or Practical Arts: 1 credit
- Physical Education (HOPE): 1 credit
- Electives: 8 credits
- Online Course Requirement

Grade Point Average Requirement:

• State of Florida: 2.0 on a 4.0 scale

State Assessment Requirements: Passing scores on the Algebra I EOC and Grade 10 FSA ELA or concordant score on the ACT or SAT. Graduates must meet all End of Course Assessment requirements and take the FCLE.

CLASS OF 2024 PROFILE

FSWC-Lee has a graduation rate of 100%. The Class of 2024 received over 230 college acceptance letters and had an 80% acceptance rate with college admissions.
